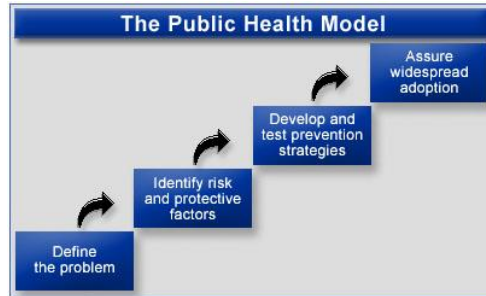

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Mission

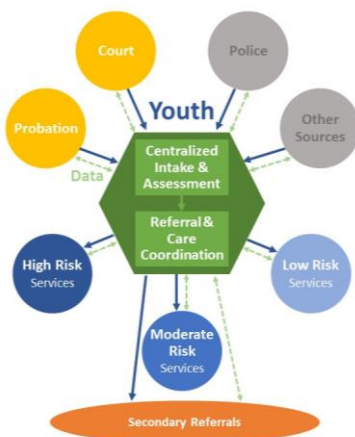

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Overview: About TASC

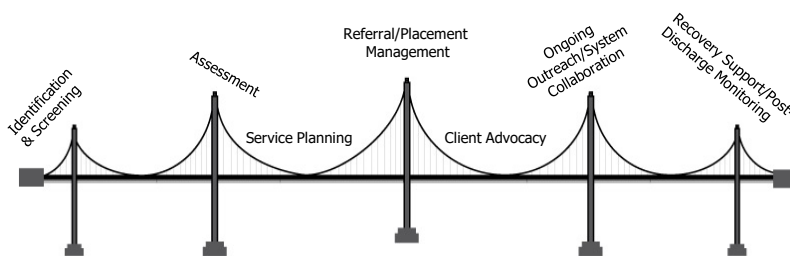
- Independent, nonprofit organization in Illinois

- Core services: Case management/ Care Coordination
- Impact: Reduced incarceration of people with behavioral health conditions, reduced recidivism, increased safety and satisfaction for victims, increased health and recovery

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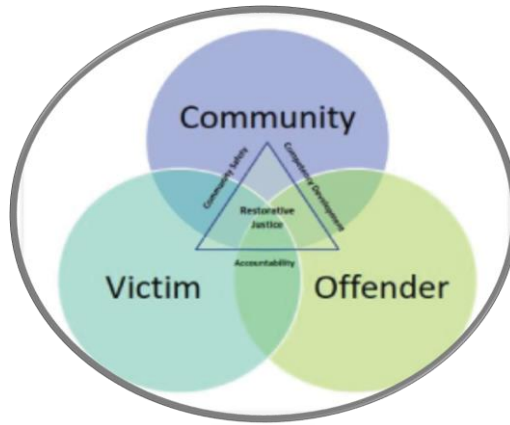

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2018 Expansion & Enhancements

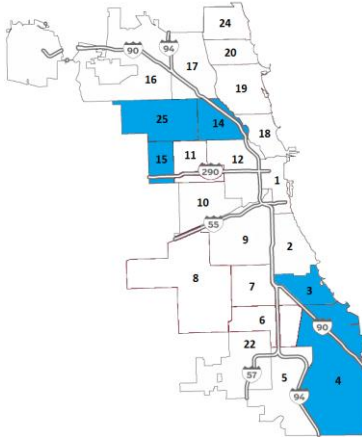


- Implementation of the Family Support Project

- SCY Data Specialist

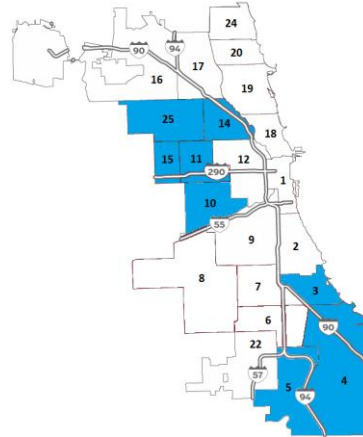
