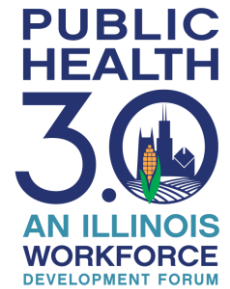


Public Health 3.0

Public Health 3.0, is a national model and major upgrade in public health practice to emphasize cross-sectoral environmental, policy, and systems-level actions that directly affect the social determinants of health and advance health equity. A forum is planned to focus on how the Illinois public health system can integrate the recommendations and components from Public Health 3.0. In Illinois many communities have already developed community partnerships and 11 Illinois local health departments and the state health department have achieved national public health accreditation.

Forum Objectives:

1. Describe the local health department role of Chief Health Strategist to address social determinants of health, assess how you are fulfilling this role and create plans to advance your health department in this role

3. Understand best practices for local cross-sectoral data sharing
4. Identify at least one new innovative funding strategy
5. Identify opportunities to better align with Public Health 3.0 principles through accreditation related standards and improvements

May 2nd will be targeted to staff from Illinois governmental public health agencies to explore the role of chief health strategist and engage in interactive self-assessment and planning activities to advance their health department in this role. Local health departments are encouraged to invite their key community health partners, including hospitals and other healthcare providers, to join them on May 3rd to explore opportunities to partner in addressing the social determinants of health, identify and engage in cross-sector data sharing, look at innovative funding models and apply quality improvement strategies to advance their work.
