Vaccines are required for pre-school and school enrollment in Illinois. Commonly known as “shots,” these required vaccines protect your child from contagious illnesses including chicken pox, diphtheria, hepatitis, measles, meningitis, mumps, pneumonia, polio, rubella, tetanus, and whooping cough (pertussis).

Additional vaccines for the flu and other illnesses are also available for pre-school and school children and for babies, toddlers and adults over age 18.
